Good evening Elizabeth,

Thank you for your reply, here is my statement of intention;

Rearing of 3 - 5 chickens for egg production.

Housing will be a purpose built coop with nest box, an enclosed run taking up an area of 6' x 4' will be attached to the side of the coop with an automated door.

The run will be enclosed using a minimum of 12 gauge mesh with a 300mm skirt pinned around the frame base, the roof will be polycarbonate with guttering and a water barrel to collect drinking water.

Padlocks will be used on the doors to the run, coop and nest box.

The waste will be composted and the run will be a deep litter type to avoid any bad smells.

Feed won't be stored onsite, the hopper will be a vermin proof type which the chickens have to stand on using their weight to gain access to the pellets, a vermin trap will be kept by the coop and monitored daily just incase.

When I mentioned a meeting it was an allotment committee meeting I had in mind.
