A presentation on Cyber Awareness was given by 2 members of the Digital Investigations and Intelligence Unit. The slides from the presentation are attached.

In summary:-

CYBER Dependent crime

Digital system is target as well as means of attack. Main focus of Cybercrime investigation unit.

Malware – disrupts and damages

DDoS paralyses by flooding with traffic

Hacking – gaining unauthorised access

Cyber Enabled crime –

Crime that is made easier by using a computer.

Top tips to help prevent cyber crime.

- Create a separate password for your email
- Create a strong password using ThreeRandomWords – add special characters
- Save your passwords in your browser
- Password manager app
- Turn on two-factor authentication (2FA)
- Update your devices - make sure software is updated
- Turn on backup

Launched May 2020 – 31/1/2021 - 4.5million reports!

To date, millions of e-mails have been forwarded, 10,000s of malicious URLs taken down.

e-mails are processed automatically so don't worry about sending too many!

Inspector Doug Downing is moving on and will be replaced by Inspector James Brain from April 1st.

General crim is down

Slight increase in Covid breaches – young people mainly

RWB – county lines – specific group of vulnerable young people and cuckoo'ed addresses. The police have been carrying out disruptive activities.

School return – will be focussing on road safety

Plan focussing on **RWB Infants** – will be rolled out to other schools

Reassurance patrols are being carried out following anti-vax leaflet campaign.

A - The Lyneham suspect is probably from London. Price of dogs in lockdown is cause of increase.

Q – Mary Champion – asked about police protocol after a visit at 4am!! Worried about frightening people.

A – the police would only do this if necessary

Q – John Hughes – County Lines – ok to disrupt but have you caught Mr Big?

A - Operation Fortitude is looking at the big picture
