9. For what purpose or project is the grant requested? *

Project Name: Street First Aid Roadshow - St John Ambulance Community Network in Salisbury and South Wiltshire supports local communities with not only the provision of First Aid cover at local events of all sizes but also in education and delivery of free, an low-cost, First Aid Training across a range of communities. Especially focussing on 3-ways to save a life – CPR and how to use a Defibrillator; how to respond when someone is choking and dealing with bleeding incidents (from everyday cuts through to knife / deeper wounds), we are working within a range of communities across Wiltshire in order to deliver community first aid sessions. Throughout 2024/25 we have been delivering a number of Community First Aid sessions as described above however we have seen an increase in the need to support training in critical life-saving skills following an increase in knife-crime and violent incidents across the local area.

The Street First Aid Roadshow will bring free, accessible training to key locations across Wiltshire close to Salisbury including Lyneham and Bradenstoke, Laverstock and Ford, Old Sarum, Netherhampton, Fordingbridge, Amesbury and Bulford. We want to deliver a minimum of 10 sessions to engage local residents of all ages but particularly engaging with young people. Led by fully trained and experienced St John Ambulance volunteers, sessions will teach critical skills such as managing major bleeds, administering CPR, and using trauma kits. We would also like to give participants a Tourni-Key trauma kit, giving them the confidence and tools to act in a crisis.

To ensure widespread participation, we will actively welcome underrepresented groups, including young people, those from lower-income backgrounds, and communities with limited access to health education. By delivering training to these groups we want to remove barriers to engagement and reach those most at risk. Working with youth organisations, councils, and schools, we will further extend outreach, ensuring lasting impact beyond the roadshow itself. Each session costs £643 to deliver however we are seeking grants from a variety of sources to enable us to deliver training across a wider area.

10. What will be the total cost of the above project *

£643 per session with the aim to deliver 10 sessions = £6,430

11. If the total cost of the project is more than the grant, how will the residue be financed? *

We have been awarded a grant of £22,500 from GWR however this grant is being partly used to support set-up costs and additional operational costs including promotional items and kits. This grant will enable us to support the delivery of some sessions close to GWR Stations but we wish to widen the delivery into local Parishes across Wiltshire so are seeking smaller grants to enable us to fund volunteering delivery costs including the supply of Tourni-Key kits.

The project will benefit multiple generations across the parish as we aim to engage with as wide a community base as we can. To ensure widespread participation, we will actively welcome underrepresented groups, including young people, those from lower-income backgrounds, and communities with limited access to health education.

16. Approximately how many of those who will benefit are residents? *

On average our attendance at public facing community workshops range from 30 to 400 participants depending upon the type of event – i.e. if it is booked directly with a specific group or a public facing event with high footfall (i.e. at a Railway station or Shopping Centre). We aim to work specifically to promote these sessions with other partners such as Youth Groups, within community spaces such as libraries and at local café's or halls. We hope to engage with around 1,000 people as a minimum.
