Local Priorities & Updates

Priority	Update
Criminal Damage	Following a spate of graffiti across the play parks in RWB an offender from Lyneham has been identified and interviewed. As part of the Restorative Justice process he is now committed to engaging in the RWB Youth Club with its specialist Rise Trust support workers and associated mentor scheme. This will hopefully give the young person the opportunity to feel part of the community and to be provided with ongoing support with making the right decisions and overcoming personal challenges.
Anti Social Behaviour	We have increased patrols during the evenings and weekends to tackle ASB and potential drug use at various locations across Lyneham. This has also included a recent dedicated operation which saw Response and Neighbourhood officers complete additional proactive work to target these concerns.
Road Safety	The Neighbourhood team continue to concentrate on road safety in relation to the local schools and parking issues at drop off / collection times. We have organised joint visits with the Fire Service to promote the necessity of legal and safe parking to parents and have been robust in issuing Fixed Penalty Notices to repeat offenders. The closure of Clack Hill remains a priority for us and we continue to police the TRO and conduct speed checks. We are well supported by local residents in terms of intelligence gathering and providing information on offending drivers. We work closely with our colleagues in the Roads Policing Team and Road Safety Unit. Between us all speed checks have been conducted throughout various locations across RWB, Lyneham, Purton and surrounding villages and the Fatal 5 offences have been targeted as part of the ongoing Project Zero.
Community Engagement	This Neighbourhood Team have recorded more Community Engagements than any other team across Wiltshire Police this year. We strive to be visible and engage with all the different groups that make up our communities. In the last few weeks we have been privileged to be part of the Malmesbury Freedom of the Town and Robing Ceremonies in RWB and Malmesbury in addition to our usual social groups, coffee mornings, consultation opportunities and ongoing work with our Rural Crime Team.
